



We Drove Here: Cromwell Museum Explores Motoring History in Otago.

We Drove Here is something new for the Cromwell Museum. First shown at the Hocken Gallery in Dunedin in 2015, the exhibition has been redesigned for Cromwell Museum and uses their wonderful resources in a themed exhibition that looks at the social side of motoring. How did children entertain themselves on a long trip to the crib? What happened when the roads were flooded? Who put that giant fruitbowl there? Find out at We Drove Here at the Cromwell Museum from 11 April 2015.

We Drove Here touches on a range of subjects: pioneering motorists; road-making – both urban and rural; the infrastructure and industries that sprang up through the 20th century to support and supply demand; car clubs and motor racing; family holidays; and all the responsibilities that car (and motorcycle) ownership requires.

The exhibition fills the main gallery and foyer with classic vehicles, photos, posters and motoring collections generously loaned from the local community.

The exhibition was developed with the support of the Otago Motor Club Trust and will tour to other South Island centres following its showing at Cromwell.
